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Boyden Hall Fact Sheet

Student Accounts

- This is where students pay bills
- Handles all student tuition and fee charges and the collection of those charges
- Responsible for all disbursements of funds that may be owed to students
- Bill statements are sent out via email and can be viewed online at Infobear
- Funds can be added to student's Connect Card

Student Employment

- There are many work-study and non work-study jobs on campus
- At Student Employment a student can look at a list of available jobs and fill out applications
- Student jobs range from swiping meal plan cards, working at the Tinsley Center gym and athletic areas, library assistant, tour guide, any office assistant jobs, lab assistant, etc

Registrar's Office

- Maintains student academic records, and issues transcripts for all current/former students
- Manages the registration and drop/add processes
- Coordinates data for the College Catalog and the Course Schedule each semester
- Records grades
- Confirms the graduation status of student and orders diplomas
- Processes all changes and corrections to student records including addresses, names, and social security numbers

Horace Mann Auditorium

- Contains many of our class jazz band concerts, African drumming ensemble and small key note speakers
- Newly renovated with all new seats and a more up to date look

- Dana Mohler-Faria
- Office marked by the white balcony at the top of Boyden Hall

Art Center Fact Sheet

- All students are required to take 2 art classes to graduate
- It does not need to be a drawing class; other options include theater, dance, etc
- On the first floor is the Wallace L Anderson Gallery displaying student, professor, and professional work
- Once was used as a gym; there is a suspended track on the inside

Parking Services Office and Connect Card Office

- Sign up for a parking pass (Residents and Commuters) and pay parking fines
- Parking Pass for resident students (Sophomores and above) is \$125 for the year

Connect Card Office

- Connect Card is a student's ID on campus
- Flex Dollars, which can be used as cash, can also be added to the card

- Nicknamed Tilly by most students
- Renovated in Summer 2009
- All you can eat buffet style cafeteria with many home style foods
- One meal swipe gets a student as much food as they want

Health Services

- 3 nurse practitioners and 1 doctor on call at all times
- Take care of anything from stitches to immunizations
- Anything more than stitches, they will transport the student to Brockton Hospital about 10-15 minutes away
- Can write prescriptions for certain sicknesses
- Services are free and students can make appointments or be seen on a walk-in basis

Counseling Center

- Students experiencing adjustment and psychological difficulties
- Call or walk-in appointments
- Enhances the student's emotional, social and intellectual development, providing consultation for free

Mail Services

- Packages will be picked up here if a student receives one
- Mailboxes are assigned to every resident student, it is small and in their resident hall
- Buy stamps, mail letters or packages

Financial Aid

- Assist students and their family in affording the cost of college education
- FAFSA forms need to be filled out

Center for Multicultural and Affairs (CMA)

- Facilitate programs of diversity on campus
- · Cape Verdean nights and International food nights

Office of Student Involvement and Leadership (OSIL)

- 70 plus clubs and organizations on campus
- 3 Fraternities, 3 Sororities, and 2 co-educational Fraternities
- Student's can start their old club with 2 or more people and a faculty member to sponsor the club

BSC Student Newspaper

RCC Auditorium

- 1,450 seats with a balcony
- Many key note speakers hold lectures here
- Dance and theatre performances held here

Marshall Conant Science Building Fact Sheet

- 98.7 million dollar grant to rebuild a new science building expected to be completed in Spring 2011
- It will be the new Science and Math building
- Construction is being done in sections so areas of the building will remain open for classes to take place
- · Aviation simulators and a wind tunnel located in the building
- Since it is so large, there are overflow classrooms in the science building

Moakley Center

- Highly technological advanced building on campus
- Bridgewater State College is ranked 6th in the nation for its WiFi connection
- Lecture Hall for presentations and speakers

Moakley Auditorium

A lecture style auditorium that has 210 seats and has audio/visuals available

Open Access Lab

• The Open Access Lab contains over 90 PC and Macintosh computers and is open seven days a week for use on a walk-in basis by college staff, students and the general public

Macintosh Lab Classroom

 The MAC Lab Classroom contains 18 fully networked Macintosh computers used for teaching on-campus courses and to provide special workshops/seminars for teachers and other community groups

Moakley Television Studio

- The Moakley Center Television Facility has 2 studios one dedicated for video conferencing, and the other for video productions.
- There is an audio/prep room and 2 editing suites (linear/analog and non-linear/digital)

Information Technology (IT)

- Every student must own a laptop
- Computer lab in Moakley
- Deal with Dell: students may choose to purchase a Dell Latitude computer with three year warranty through Bridgewater State College
- IT fixes anything that is wrong with a student's computer
- Printing: every student has \$25.00 to print per semester, 10 cents for black and white print, 25 cents for color print

Burnell Hall Fact Sheet

- Attached behind Hart Hall
- Was an on campus elementary school that allowed students to do observation hours before they moved into a career in Early Education teaching
- Underwent renovation and is being used as classrooms and faculty spaces at BSC
- Children's Center daycare and preschool located in Burnell Hall

Hart Hall Fact Sheet

- Adjoins the Moakley Center and Burnell Hall
- The School of Education and Allied Studies is located in Hart Hall
- College classrooms and faculty offices for several academic departments are located here
- Contains offices of Psychology, Criminal Justice, Mathematics, Early Education and Elementary Education

Tinsley Center Fact Sheet

Academic Departments

- Department of Athletics and Recreation, as well as the Department of Movement Arts, Health Promotion and Leisure Studies
- Five academic classrooms and three Labs

Competition Court

- This is NCAA regulation Competition Basketball and Volleyball venue that seats 1000 spectators
- The court has three scoreboards for optimal spectator viewing, wired for internet access as well as wireless access and state of the art sound system
- The floor is a grade 2 Robbins bio-channel floor, and automatic bleacher system

Synthetic Multipurpose Courts

- The courts are lined for basketball, volleyball, badminton, and tennis
- This space is used by the Movement Arts, Health Promotion and Leisure study department classes, as well as varsity team practices, and intramural sports programs reign these courts in the evenings
- The space is equipped with three scoreboards, two automatic batting cages, eight basketball hoops, automatic center curtain and four walk draw curtains

Walking/Jogging Track

- The elevated three lane track is a 1/8 of a mile, which encircles the 32,000 square foot gymnasium area
- This is a great space for a stroll or a light jog year round in the buildings climate control space

Thornburg Fitness Center

- The 9,000 square foot space is equipped with the most current equipment on the market
- Cardiovascular machines, selecterized weight machines, plate loaded equipment, benches, dumbbells and two Olympic lifting platforms
- Fitness center membership fee is \$60/semester and \$100/academic year; \$25/full summer or \$12.50 per session
- The reason for the membership fee is because equipment is updated every 3 years

- Four team locker rooms, two general locker rooms, two faculty/staff locker rooms
- Equipment Issue desk, Sports Medicine Center, and a Conference room

Athletic Fields, Courts and Facilities Fact Sheet

Swenson Complex

Is equipped with an Olympic 9 lane track, Football field with 1500 seats

Swenson Pitch

Three field designated for Field Hockey / Women's Lacrosse, Soccer game and practice field

Alumni Park Softball Field

- The softball field is a natural grass outfield with a skinned infield
- Above ground dugouts and seating for 500

Alumni Park Baseball Field

- The baseball field is a natural grass outfield with a traditional infield
- Above ground dugouts and seating for 500

Dr. Henry Rosen Memorial Tennis Courts

- The newly reconstructed Dr. Henry Rosen Memorial Tennis Courts are conveniently located at the bottom of Great Hill, just a short walk from a number of student residence halls and academic facilities
- Reconstruction of the courts took place during the summer of 2001

Mary Jo Moriarty Pool

- Located in Kelly Gymnasium
- An indoor Olympic size swimming pool

- International Exchange has study tours that travel to other countries during BSC's winter, spring, and summer breaks
- 30 countries that the college directly exchanges with
- Oxford at Bridgewater, summer program at England's prestigious university Oxford

Academic Achievement Center Fact Sheet

The Disability Resources Offices

- Provides assistance to students with a documented disability by helping them with accommodations on campus; academic or physical
- Computer lab using adaptive equipment for those who need it

Tutoring Central

- Provides tutors in many of the CORE curriculum courses and in some entry level courses in a major
- Paid position for those with high marks in a course and have a professor's recommendation
- One on one tutoring for a student requiring assistance

Writing Studio

- Help students learn the elements of grammatical writing
- Gives students the tools to be able to edit their paper
- Help students start a paper, write a thesis, or better understand an assignment
- Peer consultants provide helpful feedback to student writers working at all levels
- Students may bring in any form of writing, regardless of the genre or the course

Communication Lab

- Help students refine speeches
- Provides learning tools to relieve nervous habits while talking in front of a crowd
- Tape student's speech and then allows watching it and learn how to improve

Math Services

- Assist students in math from basic math to Calculus IV
- Helps students with a certain math class or a certain aspect of math

Second Language Services

- Recruits peer tutors to assist students in succeeding in many of the foreign language courses
- Helps students who have English as a second language

Honors Program

- Accelerated program that is both reading and writing intensive
- Classes are capped at 15 students to allow students more time with the professor
- Students need a 3.0 GPA or higher

Harrington Hall Fact Sheet

School of Business

- The School of Business consists of four departments: accounting and finance, aviation science, management and economics
- All the department classes are held here
- State of the art classrooms, labs, and offices

Accounting and Finance

- The accounting track prepares students for a variety of positions leading to management level careers in corporate and public accounting, auditing and taxation
- This concentration will also assist in preparing students for the Certified Public Accountant (CPA) exam or the Certified Management Accounting (CMA) exam
- Our Accounting program is 150-hour compliant and meets all requirements to sit for the CPA examination in Massachusetts
- This concentration will also assist in preparing students for professional certifications such as the Certified Financial Planner (CFP) or Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA)

Aviation Science

- BSC offers four-year baccalaureate degrees (BS) in Aviation Science, with concentrations in Aviation Management, or Flight Training
- Our programs are approved by the FAA under Part 141 of the Federal Aviation Regulations, and are recognized by the University Aviation Association (UAA)
- Our aviation science program incorporates single engine and multi-engine flight simulator training into its flight training courses

Woodward Hall

- Freshman Resident Hall with about 250 students
- Common room and bathroom on every floor

- 1 Resident Director who live s in the building

- 1 Resident Director, 1 Senior Resident Assistant, 6 Resident Assistants who live in the building

East Hall

- Upperclassmen Resident Hall with about 300 students
- Suite Style configuration with share bathroom with each suite
- Configurations include single and double rooms
- 1 Resident Director, 1 Senior Resident Assistant, 6 Resident Assistants who live in the building

Great Hill Student Apartments

- Full functional apartments that house 200 upperclassmen student
- Apartments are complete with kitchen and bathroom
- Students live in 6 and 7 person units with a combination of double and single rooms.
- Purchase of meal plan is optional
- 1 Resident Director, 2 Resident Assistants who live in the complex

Miles and Dinardo Residence Halls

- Upperclassmen Resident Hall with about 425 students
- Primarily 2 double rooms with shared common room, some singles, triple rooms, and 7-person suites
- 1 Resident Director, 1 Senior Resident Assistant, 12 Resident Assistants between both buildings

Pope Hall

- Upperclassmen Resident Hall with about 350 students
- Double and Triple Rooms
- Common bathrooms on each floor, separated by gender
- Renovations completed in 2009, which added about 150 student residents
- 1 Resident Director, 1 Senior Resident Assistant, 8 Resident Assistants who live in the building

Scott Hall

- Upperclassmen Resident Hall with about 280 students
- Double and Triple Rooms
- Common bathrooms on each floor, separated by gender
- Renovations completed in 2009, which added about 150 student residents
- 1 Resident Director, 1 Senior Resident Assistant, 7 Resident Assistants who live in the building

BSC Bears Den

- Food Court styled setup
- Multiple stations include taco bar, salad bar, stir fry, grille, etc.
- Open for breakfast, lunch, and dinner
- Accepts meal plan, dining dollars, flex dollars, and cash

Crimson Food Court

- Food court style cafeteria
- Includes stations for pasta, pizza, salad, and stir Fry
- Includes a grille for burgers, chicken sandwiches, hot dogs, fries, etc
- Open for lunch and dinner
- · Accepts dining dollars, flex dollars, and cash

East Campus Commons

- A la carte style with a bakery, deli, gill, entrée, pasta, pizza, soup, salad, and dessert
- · Breakfast, lunch, and dinner
- Open breakfast, lunch, and dinner
- Accepts meal plan, dining dollars, flex dollars, and cash

Flynn Dining Commons

- All you can eat buffet

Meal Plan Options

A meal swipe gets a student 1 entrée, 4 sides and a drink

Dining Dollars vs. Flex Dollars

- Dining dollars are treated like cash to be used at dining halls and are included with meal plan option
- Cash added to a student's BSC Connect Card are not included with mean plan option

Campus Safety Fact Sheet

Campus Police Station

- The police men and women are sworn in by the state
- They can make arrests
- Patrol the campus day and night
- 15 full time, 21 part time
- Provides rides after 3am when Safety Escort Vans are not in service

Safety Escort Vans

- Drive around campus from 7pm to 3am
- Allow students to have a safe ride around campus so they do not have to walk
- There is a dispatch number to call and students tell them to pick them up at one destination and beings you to another

Blue Light Phones

- Located throughout campus with a blue light shining on top of it 24 hours a day
- Press the Emergency Help Button and 3 police officers will surround the light in less than 60 seconds
- When button is pushed light with go off and there will be a loud emergency sound letting the whole campus know that the button has been pushed
- Call safety escort and police station from the blue light phones
